The programme is delivered at the campus of Trinity's Associated College, Marino Institute of Education (MIE). The International Foundation Programme provides a pathway for strong international students who are not yet academically ready to directly enter undergraduate programmes in Trinity and who require additional support to meet the demands of studying academic subjects at University level through English as a second language. Students who successfully complete the International Foundation Programme and reach the required grades/ entry requirements will gain entry to the first year of their chosen undergraduate degree at Trinity or MIE.
