#### **Description:**

The successful candidate will have:

• A qualification in early learning and care / early childhood care and education at Level 8 or higher on the National Framework of Qualifications (or equivalent) AND at least three years of relevant work experience at a senior level, including working in the field of children's services, early learning and care or other learning initiatives and/or public health projects directly;
