Our service interventions include individual and group supports aimed at improving students' emotional and social competencies, their motivation and engagement for school, learning dispositions and overall educational achievement. We are seeking to employ one full-time Project Worker to join our team.

As a Project Worker you will work in both primary and post-primary, providing a range of in/out/after and holiday school supports. You will work alongside an experienced transdisciplinary team and have an opportunity to avail of a range of quality training.

Essential:

- Some experience of working with vulnerable children and families either through voluntary or paid means;
- Experience or knowledge and an understanding of the issues that prevent children and young people from succeeding in school;
- Experience of planning, implementing and reviewing intervention programmes;
- Group facilitation experience (advantageous)
- Experience of providing emotional support to children and/or young people;
- Knowledge of evidence-based practices and approaches (e.g. solution focused interaction, motivational interviewing, cognitive behavioural therapy approaches, conflict resolution methods, etc.). You will have an opportunity to avail of free training in some of these.
- A recognised third level qualification (minimum Level 8 on the NFQ) in a relevant discipline (i.e., psychology, education, social work, youth work, health allied disciplines).
